2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The assessment of students' learning levels and academic performance at Y.K. College, Wangjing is done by subject teachers and faculty mentors who keep an eye on the students' progress by observing them in the classroom, in laboratories, and during the mentoring process.

The subject teachers administer four unit assessments per semester to all students in order to conduct an exhaustive assessment of their learning abilities. 60% and higher is the category used to identify advanced learners, whereas less than 60% is used to identify slow learners. The teachers then classify students into advanced and slow learners based on the average results of the students' performances during these assessments. The prepared list of students' results is then submitted to the IQAC, which then transfers it to the remedial coaching centre to improve the performances of the slow learners and prepare for final examinations.

The remedial coaching centre then prepares a remedial programme

that provides special classes and tutorial classes by teachers to help slow learners. Bilingual explanations and discussions are provided for slow learners.

The teaching - learning methods at Y. K. College include:

Experiential Learning:

Laboratory practical classes: Most subjects, such as Botany, Chemistry, Zoology and Physics, include regular laboratory components as part of their course requirements.

Study tours and practical work: The College organises field trips for students studying Botany, Geography and Economics. These field trips are integrated into the curriculum. Practical work is also carried out for Education and Geography Departments.

Short-term Computer Course: The College organises a 30-hour short-term course on Computer Operation to improve students' computer learning experiences in an effort to uplift and empower them.

Short-term Course on Mushroom Cultivation: The College organises a 30-hour short-term course on Mushroom Cultivation to generate local employment opportunities and promote the cultivation of mushrooms.

As per the National Education Policy 2020 Undergraduate syllabus, skill enhancement courses are included in all subjects (Arts and Sciences). The students are imparted value-based and skill-based knowledge.

Participative Learning:

The MOODLE-LMS platform is used to interpret, explain, and revise lesson content to help learners better understand the topic. Interactive online methods are used in group discussions, online quizzes, learning material uploads, PPTs, and web-links shared with students to promote self-paced learning.

Complaints regarding internal assessment marks at the college or university level are resolved through the concerned faculty members and HODs and then informed to the examination convenor for rectification within the stipulated time.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The twelve departments of the college have separate departmental rooms. In addition, a separate room is allotted for Environmental Science teachers. All departments have their own class rooms in addition to eight common class rooms. Other rooms available are those of central computer laboratory, Miniconference hall, conference hall, students' union room and common rooms of teachers, boys, girls and ladies. All laboratories of Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Physics and Zoology departments have been well equipped while that of Education department was at initial stage. Two overhead tanks distribute water to different sections of the institution. Separate pipe fitted toilets for gents, ladies, girls, boys and teachers are available in the campus. Above all college cafeteria locates near the main gate. All the rooms were electrified with safety devices.

The availability of lease line connection of 8 mbps had enable rendering of free WiFi to the students as well as staffs. Three of the common class rooms had smart board facilities while only Geography and Mathematics departments had installed smart boards among the departments. Nevertheless, smart boards had been installed in mini conference hall and conference hall so that altogether there were 7 installed smart boards. Moreover, lady's common room had installed sanitary vending machine for use mainly by girl students.

It has a sports store room and a sports office room. Annual badminton and table tennis tournaments (2022-23) of the college were held in the indoor hall. Moreover, Thoubal district level inter college badminton and table tennis tournaments (1-3 August, 2022) were organised by this institution in commemoration of 75th independence day and patriot's day under the sponsorship of Directorate of University and Higher Education, Manipur Government. The institution takes opportunity of playing outdoor games in the adjoining 'District Sports Stadium, Thoubal'. Moreover, the institution extended the facility of learning swimming and doing exercises as well in its swimming pool.

The institute has another Gym for girls. The equipments available are cycle(3), gym ball(2), step board(5), kettle bell(35 kg), round dumbbell (55kg), yoga mats(10) etc. Girls do gym exercises during extra class hours under the supervision of a teacher in charge.

Teacher of NEP-2020 Value Addition Course of Yoga also taught Yoga to individuals other than students during extra class hours. Thus, it is functioning like a Yoga centre.

Classrooms

All the classrooms were well ventilated, moderately spacious and had windows to illuminate enough during day time from natural light to enable conduction of class without power use. Only three of the eight common classrooms and two departmental class rooms had installed smart boards.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

All the teachers and Librarian were the members of at least two committees/ cells. Thus majority of them take part in the decision making of the related committees/cells. The convener/ coordinator/ nodal officer of the committee/ cell proposed the agenda for calling a meeting and resolution was passed when decided unanimously or by majority of the members. Convener of Games and Sports Committee managed all about participation of students in inter college games and sports M.U. Similarly convener(s) of Seminar Committee and Examination Committee etc. executed willingly the related tasks. Principal took up steps for appointing convener of the examination committee as OC of semester end examinations by the concerned Manipur University authority.

During the year 2022-23, seven secretaries of the students union viz, General, Finance, Games and Sports, Social and Culture, Debate and Extension, Boys Common Room and Girls Common Room were elected. General and Social and Culture Secretaries took the charge of Magazine Secretary. These secretaries along with their teachers in charge play important role in the college administration.

Mentors play very important roles in guiding students. Moreover Grievance Redressal Cell remainedactive throughout the year to solve related problems readily.

6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

The institution is a full-fledged government college and the teachers entertain the opportunity of selecting either UGC regulation 2016 or UGC regulation 2018 for their placement. It was due to the reason that Manipur Government has fully implemented the above mentioned UGC regulations for placement of teachers to higher stages of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor. On 11.07.2022 Directorate of University and Higher Education, Manipur Government circulated notice for placement of teachers to the above mentioned posts. Later the institution notified for the submission self-appraisal forms in time. ACRs of the teachers were strictly as well as confidentially written by the principal. The placement process was still undergoing.

6.4 - Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

The institution being run by the government, is under the jurisdiction of Local Fund Manipur and AG Manipur for carrying out external audit for non government, UGC and RUSA account.

For the year 2022-23 auditing of all accounts of the institution by Local Fund Audit, Manipur had been carried out up to December 2022. They underwent auditing for three days in the college office and called all required documents. No case of audit objection was raised by the auditors.

The college office recorded all expenditures incurred for various purposes. Thus cheque issue register was well maintained to enable clarification about expenditures if inquired. Alumni Secretary and DDO assistant served as internal Auditors. They regularly checked income, expenditures and mode of payments and violation of payments against resolutions passed by the teacher association. After finalising internal auditing documents were passed to Charter Accountant for undergoing annual auditing requested by the institution.

Accounting of the accounts of the college in any case had not been pended as AG, Manipur and Local Fund Audit, Manipur usually undertook auditing by giving short notification. However, there was no AG auditing in the year 2022-23.

The Woman Complaint Cell always remained ready to face any crime if happened on the campus and anywhere among the women folk of the college by deferring to the Manipur Woman Commission readily. Our institute has a separate common room for the women's group where the women gather, hold meetings, and discuss women-related problems separately.

friendly waste management steps have been taken up by the Environment Club of Y.K. College. Wastes have been divided into biodegradable and non-biodegradable. The waste disposal bins made of plastic (issued by Go Clean) were installed on the campus separately for biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes. The biodegradable waste including mostly papers, litter such as dried leaves or plant clippings, and kitchen wastes from the college canteen were used for composting.

The non-biodegradable wastes such as a certain amount of glasses including from science laboratories, plastic wastes such as empty packaged drinking waterbottles, plastic cups, empty package of foods, stationary wastes which are of plastic products like discarded pens, ink bottles, plastic file covers, etc. were put into separate dustbins and all these waste materials were disposed of by Go Clean. The liquid wastes were disposed of through draining but the sanitary wastes from toilets were disposed of into the sanitary tank with proper water facility. If wastes are scattered on the campus here and there, the volunteers of college NSS units I and II organize social service programs for cleaning the campus on Sundays and non-teaching staff often collect the solid wastes into dustbins.

A) Title of the Practice: Monetary Assistance for Boosting up Curricular and Extra Curricular activities of students and teachers

Objectives of the Practice:

The majority of the students in this institute belongs to poor families of rural areas since the institute itself resides in rural region and on another aspect, it can be assumed that sports loving students of the college are many who couldn't afford the necessities regarding their career development. 7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 200 words

The institution is a full-fledged government institution located in the southern side of the Thoubal district. So the institution follows educational policy of the affiliating university and Manipur government.

The college authority collected information timely from Manipur University (central) authority and Directorate of University and Higher Education, Manipur government about mandatory introduction of NEP-2020 undergraduate courses in the affiliating colleges of this university. The college authority, Head of Departments and teachers decided to comply this and joined hands to commence NEP-2020 class onwards the academic session 2022-23 under the ordinance and curricula of Manipur University. Meanwhile some teachers participated FDPs sponsored by the Directorate of University and Higher Education, Manipur Government in relation with implementation of NEP 2020.

The institution took up all measures for timely registration of 1st semester students into ABC. Value Addition Courses such as NSS, YOGA, Environmental Ethics, MUKNA (a folk wrestling game of Manipur) have been opened.
